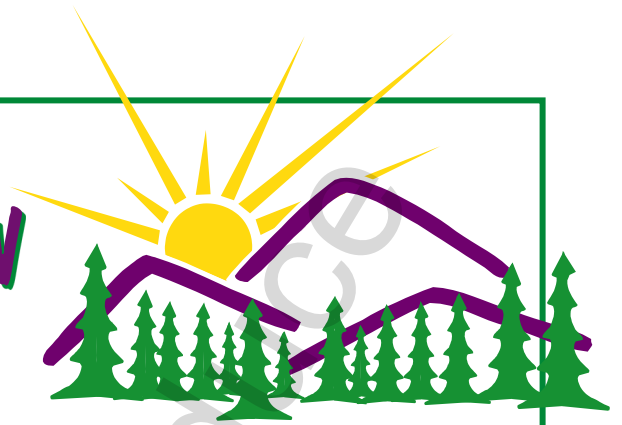


# All Things Made New

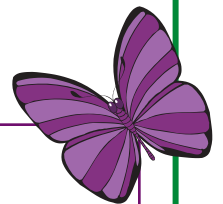

**God Made All Things Good**

God is wise and powerful. He created everything from nothing! And God created in just the right order. What if God had created animals before creating water and land? Where would the animals live? What would they eat? At the end of each day of creation, God looked at what He made “and saw that it was good.” This

means that everything was what God wanted it to be. God did not make any mistakes. The whole world was perfect!

**God Made Man and Woman**

The last thing God created was people. God created man and woman in His own image. This means God made them like Himself in some ways, such as being able to think and make choices.

God made man out of the dust, and breathed life into him. Next, God planted a garden — the Garden of Eden, filled with good things for the man to enjoy. The first man Adam named all the animals God had created. Have you ever thought how much fun it would be to name all the animals? God gave Adam a big and important job to name all animals on the earth.

Adam saw all the animals, but he did not find anyone among them to be his friend and helper. God knew it wasn’t good for Adam to be alone so He created a helper for him. God used one of Adam’s ribs and created woman, whose name was Eve. God brought

Adam and Eve together as husband and wife, and told them to stay together. God’s plan from the beginning was for one man and one woman to marry and to love and help each other for life.

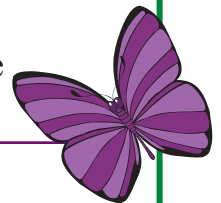

live. He gave them work and responsibility. He gave them each other. God is a good and great God!

### Man and Woman Sinned

Have you noticed how the one thing we're told not to do is what we usually want to do? Eve had the same

problem in the Garden of Eden. God told Adam and Eve they could eat the fruit of any tree except one — the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. They knew God's instructions, but Satan came along and lied to Eve. He came in the form of a serpent or snake. The serpent tempted Eve by telling her to go ahead and eat whatever she wanted. He said things would be better if she ate the fruit, but he lied.

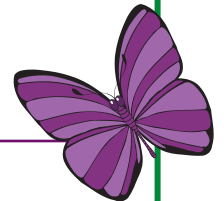
Eve listened to the serpent instead of God and ate fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. She gave some of the fruit to Adam, and he ate it, also. This was sin, and it brought a lot of trouble to Adam and Eve, and to the whole world.

Because they sinned against God, Adam and Eve had to leave the perfect place God gave them, and their lives were filled with trouble. Sin causes trouble, doesn't it? Sin is against God and takes us away from God. Sin is a big problem that brings trouble to the whole world.

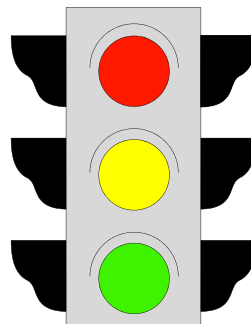

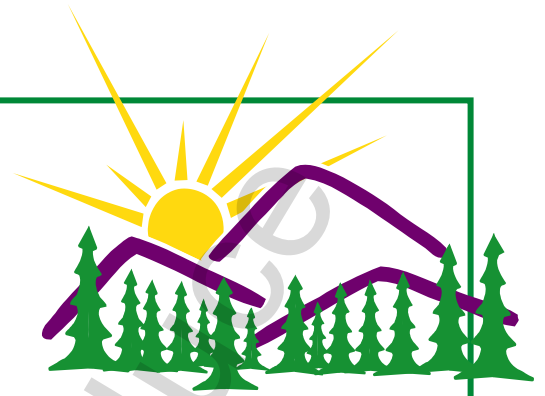
